Pastor's House Funding Appeal



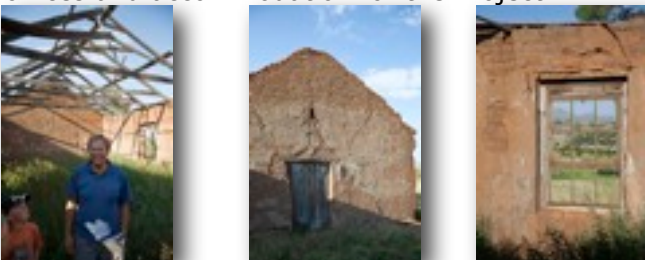
The work of the Growing Nations in Maphutseng continues to have an amazing impact on the lives of the people of Lesotho and beyond.

Crop yields this year are excellent once again, significantly better than the non-Conservation Agriculture (CA) fields throughout Lesotho. The pastors training, which started just under a year ago has also been a great success, with a second group of trainees due to start in September.



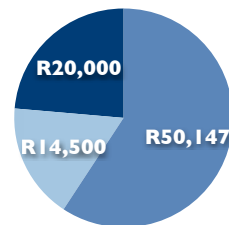
Comparative CA and local non-CA fields, Maphutseng

The training facility is in full use but the next stage of the development will be to rebuild the old derelict Pastor's house. This will provide a much improved living environment for Rev. Moletsane, the pastor at Maphutseng, and his family. The Old Mission House will then be renovated and used as offices and accommodation for the Project.



As can be seen, a lot of work needs to be done to complete the task, including installing a new roof, ceilings, internal walls, doors and windows.

Renovation Costs

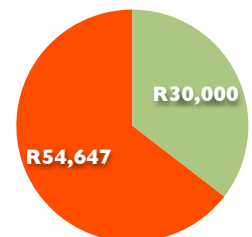


- Roof

To aid us in this process, two fabulous youth groups from Stellenbosch (SA) and Winchester (UK) will be visiting the project in June and August respectively. During their time here they will be working hard to carry out the planned rebuilding/renovation of the old Pastor's House.

So far we have received ZAR 30,000 (US\$3,947) specifically for the project, leaving us with a further ZAR 54,647 (US\$7,190) to raise in order to meet the total anticipated costs of ZAR 84,700.
